

- **6. Chinatown:** The Chinatown area is quite different from the rest of Singapore. It has low rise buildings of Chinese Architecture, and the Chinese culture is exhibited out on the streets with the enticing smell of Chinese cuisines being cooked. There are temples of all faiths among which Buddha tooth relic temple and Sri Mariamman Temple are visited more often.
- **7. Singapore Flyer:** At 165 meters tall, this giant observation wheel is an artful culmination of urban design and building that exhibits not just the hypnotizing cosmopolitan cityscape of the tropical Lion City but also the encompassing islands of Indonesia and parts of Malaysia in all their glory. It often features on the advertorial boards of Singapore Tourism.
- **8. Sentosa:** This sunny island is home to amusement attractions, world-famous spas, lush green rainforests, golden sand beaches, and resort-themed hotels. A perfect holiday's escape overall.
- **9. Singapore Night Safari:** Singapore Night Safari is more than just a typical wildlife safari as it is the world's very first wildlife night park where you can find nocturnal animals actively roaming with their gleaming eyes. The Wildlife Safari covers around seven geographical regions, each of which is equally fascinating.
- **10.** Little India: Little India is a lively historic area in the heart of Singapore around the Serangoon road. This place is a must-visit as you can explore a





When is the best time to visit Singapore?

- The months between February to April when the island country has summers going on is a good season to be in Singapore.
- Similarly, the winters here are quite pleasant as well. Plenty of outdoor activities become available during these two seasons.
- Moreover, November to January is when the country has the wettest months and showers can last for long periods of time, so you may want to avoid this season unless you're fond of travelling in rains. The hottest months in Singapore usually are May and June.

Do I need a visa for Singapore? How does one get a Singapore visa?

Citizens of India can apply for a Singapore tourist visa that allows a stay for maximum period of 30 days with a validity of 2 years. As the rule applies for other countries, even for Singapore, you should ensure that your passport is valid for 6 months from the date of entry in Singapore.

The easiest way to apply for your visa is filling the form online. You have to pay the fees and your request is registered. You may also be provided with a pick and drop service. Some of the vital documents required for visa application procedure are air ticket, passport, bank statement of last three months, covering letter, visa application form and 2 passport size photographs.

What is the currency of Singapore and where can I get my money exchanged?

The currency of Singapore is Singapore Dollars. You can get your currency changed in any part of the country as and when required. As Singapore is a popular tourist destination, you find money changers in every part of the country easily. However, in case you're unable to find one in the area you're residing, you can always go to the airport or the banks. These money exchangers provide the service at slightly greater cost but are hassle free.

1.TRAIN-

MRT (mass rapid transit) system is probably the fastest way to zip around in Singapore. Most of Singapore's key attractions are within walking distance from any MRT station, thanks to this extensive rail service.

2. TAXI-

3. BUS-

Singapore has four official languages which are English, Malay (Bahasa Melayu), Chinese (Mandarin), and Tamil. You can usually speak English and have a good communication with people who understand the language completely. You may find difficulty in understanding though, as the accent of the locals is different to that of an Indian, British or American.

Here are some common greetings in Malay which is widely spoken in Singapore-

- Good Morning: Selamat pagi (sounds like "pag-ee")
- Good Afternoon: Selamat tengah hari (sounds like "teen-gah har-ee")
- Good Evening: Selamat Petang (sounds like "puh-tong")
- Good Night: Selamat Malam (sounds like "mah-lahm")


